### FROM THE PASTOR:

**Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Bear Witness is June 21–July 4.** The bishops of the United States are again asking us to celebrate the “Fortnight for Freedom” this year with a focus on the “freedom to bear witness” to the truth of the Gospel. This is first and foremost a spiritual effort, not a political one. The benefits of religious freedom (namely, recognition of natural rights of religious practice and of conscience, of the right to live one’s faith in a consistent way in daily life, of the just limits of government power, of the priority of certain moral realities to civil law, etc.) are for all, and the loss of religious freedom affects all. We therefore engage in this effort in a spirit of prayer, solidarity, and atonement for the sins of our country against human freedom. This event covers the time in our liturgical calendar which celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power.

Throughout these fourteen [14] we are also asked to fast and pray and to encourage all our parishioners to fast and pray, for our country and for the defense of religious freedom during these two weeks. “Fasting” means any pious act of self-denial, with the intention of joining that to the merits of Christ. It could be, for example, similar to the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fasting, or it could be abstaining from meat, or from dessert, or the like, on certain days. In terms of prayers, Bishop Nickless particularly recommends the Rosary; and since, in so many of our parishes, there are many who so diligently and devoutly pray the Rosary, they can easily be encouraged to offer at least some of these prayers for this intention.

*“Keeping the spirit of the Gospel means that Catholic institutions are to bear witness in love to the full truth about the human person by providing social, charitable, and educational services in a manner that fully reflects the God-given dignity of the human person.” - Archbishop William E. Lori, Chairman, Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, on the “Freedom to Bear Witness”.*

Today is the Twelfth (12<sup>th</sup>) Sunday in Ordinary Time. St. Paul reminds us we have become new creations in Christ. As

such, we are to continue to turn away from sin so that God may continue to transform our lives. Such a transformation is meant to set our hearts on fire for the Lord Jesus, and move us to give faithful witness to the Gospel.

The Liturgy requires many ministers. This week I wish to focus on the ministry of the Reader of God’s Word. We are in need of some additional Reader of God’s Word as there are times and some Masses when we are short or missing Reader of God’s Word. If you know of anyone who would make a good Reader of God’s Word, please ask them to volunteer using the form inside this bulletin.

They conferred their mission and authority upon their successors, the bishops, through the laying on of hands. This process is called APOSTOLIC SUCCESSION.

**LITURGICAL MATTERS**

"In the celebration of Mass the faithful form a holy people, a people of God's own possession and a royal Priesthood, so that they may give thanks to God and offer the unblemished sacrificial Victim not only by means of the hands of the Priest but also together with him and so that they may learn to offer their very selves. They should, moreover, take care to show this by their deep religious sense and their charity toward brothers and sisters who participate with them in the same celebration. . . . Moreover, they are to form one body, whether in hearing the word of God, or in taking part in the prayers and in the singing, or above all by the common offering of the Sacrifice and by participating together at the Lord's table" (GIRM, nos. 95, 96). The participation of each person in the Liturgy is important. Each person needs to do his or her part.

**MISSION STATEMENT:** The mission of St Michael's Parish is to respond to our baptismal call, serve God, congregation and community with our talents and resources. **FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK:** **Small changes** can bring big uproars. I felt saddened and disappointed by the report I heard that a number of parishioners were upset by a slight change in how the bulletins are distributed at the end of Mass as was announced in the June 7 bulletin in the instructions for Ushers that remain unchanged from the instructions issued in 2009. When we come to Mass, we are expected to stay until the Mass ends. As I stated in my homily on the Body and Blood of Christ Sunday, we are not to leave Mass until the presider has left the church building. Leaving Mass early is a disrespect of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the parish community, and of our Lord and Savior. Remember, the first person to leave Mass early was Judas, the betrayer of Jesus.

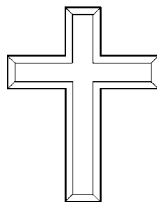

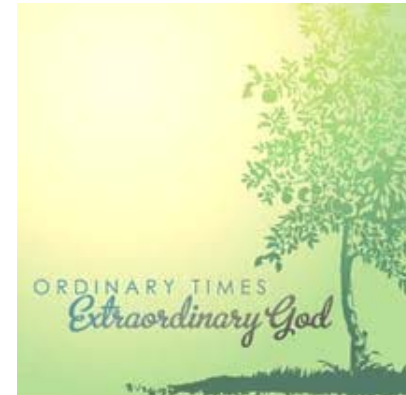

## READERS OF GOD'S WORD INSTRUCTIONS

1. The best Reader of God's Word is one who is prepared and knows well the reading that is to be proclaimed. A passage from scripture is not to be read but proclaimed! A passage from scripture is not a newspaper article you might read to someone. A passage from scripture is a special text that is to be proclaimed as if it is the first-time anyone has heard it and in such a way your proclamation says that **THIS IS THE WORD OF GOD!**
  
2. **Before Mass**
  - Find a substitute if you are unable to serve when you are scheduled.
  - Be rested.
  - Dress well.
  - Arrive 10 minutes before Mass (15-30 minutes before Funerals and other special Masses such as Holy Week).
  
3. **In the Sacristy**
  - Look over readings in the Lectionary and the Liturgy Plan sheet.
  - Receive any instructions from the priest.
  - Take the Lectionary and the Liturgy Plan sheet to the Ambo.
  
4. **During Mass**
  - The Adult Reader carries the Book of the Gospels in procession and places it on the center of the Altar.
  - After Opening Prayer, the first Reader of God's Word approaches the Ambo, bows to the Altar, steps up to the Ambo, pauses, and proclaims First Reading.
  - **MOST IMPORTANT:** proclaim your passage **SLOWLY**. There is no need to rush. Take your time. Let every word be spoken carefully thus not over-looking its importance. Pause at periods (.). Pause at the end. Wait a few seconds before announcing: "THE WORD OF THE LORD." There is no need to adjust the microphone (in most cases). By speaking slowly and clearly, everyone will be able to hear.
  - Wait a few seconds after the people have responded before leaving the Ambo or going into the next reading or psalm.
  - When departing the Ambo and Sanctuary, bow to the Altar.
  - The second Reader of God's Word approaches the Ambo, bows to the Altar, steps up to the Ambo, pauses, and proclaims the Responsorial Psalm unless the cantor(s) and/or choir may sing the refrain and/or the Psalm verses. There is no announcement "The Responsorial Psalm is..."
  - The second Reader of God's Word proclaims the Second Reading.
  - The second Reader of God's Word proclaims the Gospel Acclamation verse between the singing of the Alleluia, (never say "Alleluia"—if it is not sung, it is not to be recited) unless the cantor(s) and/or choir sings the verse.

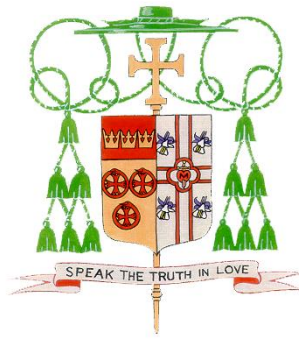
- Close the Lectionary and place it on the shelf under the top of the Ambo.
- Return to your seat and listen attentively to Gospel and the homily.
- As the Creed is concluding, approach the Ambo to proclaim the Universal Prayer [petitions/prayers of the faithful/general intercessions]). Remain at the Ambo until after the presider concludes the intercessions with a prayer and then return to your pew.

**5. After Mass**

- Return the Lectionary, The Book of the Gospels, and the Liturgy Plan sheet to the sacristy.
- Thank you for proclaiming God's Word!
