Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Most of us care what people think about us. We want to have good reputations; we want to be well-thought of; we want others to like and say nice things about us. But we rarely hear the truth about ourselves: the criticisms, the uncomplimentary comments, even the snide remarks, are usually spoken behind our backs. Even when there's praise to be offered and compliments to be made, speaking them can be awkward and they often go left unsaid. So, we ask a friend, someone we trust and hope will tell us what people are really saying about us.

Jesus asks those closest to him, "Who do people say that I am?" The disciples had heard what people were saying. They had also watched and listened to Jesus as he taught and worked miracles. They'd be able to tell him the truth about what others said: "John the Baptist (*who was beheaded*), Elijah (*the first great prophet*), or some other great prophet.

And then Jesus asks a more loaded question; a far more personal and important question, "But you, who do you say that I am?" Jesus is far more concerned about what his Apostles thought. They were his closest friends and more was hanging on their answer.

At first, the question is met with silence and only one of them had the gumption to respond. Peter could have said, "Jesus, you're awesome, you're a great miracle worker, you're a sensitive man who cares about everyone - especially those who are suffering, and I've come to love you as my best friend." But that's not what Peter said. Instead he said, "You're the Christ of God."

And in response Jesus told them to keep quiet about it. Peter gave the correct answer, and Jesus tells them to keep it to themselves. In as many words he's saying, "I am not who you think I am—I'm not a conquering king. And I have not come to do what you want me to do—I won't overthrow the Romans and set you in their place."

Instead he tells them what's really going to happen and what he expects of them—what death he'll endure and what demands would be made of them. He'll lead and they'll follow. But Jesus' words are expressed as an invitation. "If anyone wishes to come after me... whoever wishes to save his life..." There's no demand or obligation here. For Jesus, his question had everything to do with his life's work and their part in it, work that would unavoidably lead to the cross. And to follow him, to believe in him, as he hoped they would, is to understand that to love others means to give all that you have for them.

This invitation, once extended to the disciples, is now extended to us. And just as Jesus wanted each of his disciples to make a personal commitment to him, he now asks the same of us. "No one else can offer our assent." Each of us has our own free will and our own heart to give him in faith. And this is what Jesus cherishes most from us. We have this wonderful gift called "freedom"—a gift given by God himself—to accept or reject Jesus' invitation. Only we can give him the answer to his question, "Who do you say that I am?" We answer the question every day of our lives with some form of sacrifice—in the decisions we make, the friends we choose, how we decide to use our time, and how we treat others - especially the weakest and those unable to care for themselves. Some sacrifices are easy, some will bring us joy and others will bring on suffering. Within everything that happens to us, chances are we'll find the cross waiting, and each decision will provide us with the chance to do what we promised; to do what we said we'd do when we gave our personal answer to the Lord's question, "Who do you say that I am?"

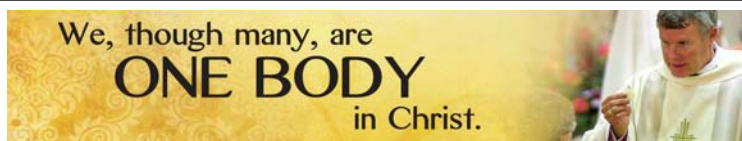
