Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Back in Jesus' day the Jewish faith was centered on the Temple in Jerusalem. It was THE place of worship for the Jewish people, where the glory of the one, true God resided. It was the site of their heavenly sacrifices, the home of the best copies of their scriptures, and where you would find the holiest, most learned men in Israel.

The Temple was their rock of Gibraltar. They believed that it was there to stay because God was there to stay. Their temple was the one place they could count on—in good times or in bad—and it was beautiful, a wonder to behold. But in this week's gospel we hear a voice of dissent. Jesus makes a bold pronouncement. Even the rock of Gibraltar crumbles. Even the most solid of temples fall to the ground.

It's a case of looking inward before you can look outward. Jesus calls on us to set our sights not on temples built by human hands, but the lasting temple that God builds in our hearts. The foundation of which was laid during our baptism. From there, it is a long, slow, building project that sometimes gets our cooperation and other times not. But God is a faithful, steady worker. God promises to build us up in ways that bring us peace and joy, but ways that will also bring us scorn and suffering. Because we cannot see this temple, we sometimes doubt its existence and goodness. Maybe this is why we sell ourselves short or think of ourselves incapable of being an image of God's presence in the world.

That's why, when it comes to the life of faith, we are more comfortable with merely being a member of the audience—or at most only playing a role in the supporting cast. But we resist taking a leading role on the stage of our lives because we doubt that we are capable of living up to and accomplishing the part God has created us for.

Around 10 years ago or so, HBO hosted a special called "Last Letters Home: Voices of American Troops from the Battlefields of Iraq." The show featured letters written by American soldiers to their families. They were letters to be opened "just in case." Well, sadly enough, the time came for the letter to be opened happened and a few grieving families agreed to share their letter.

These letters expressed the soldiers' love of family members, love of God, and their hope for healing and redemption. To hear the words of these letters was to hear the work of God expressed in the depths of the human heart. They reveal a temple not made by human hands but rather, made in God's image and likeness. These soldiers were no canonized saints. They were not mystics or sages. They were simply ordinary people who in their situations and hearts revealed God's extraordinary grace. In the end, it was apparent that holiness is not the providence of a few but a temple given to many.

The Holy Spirit gives structure to our lives. The Spirit forms us and leads us so that we can then give shape to our church, our community, and our world. Truth be told, our faith is also all about a temple. Not the one that crumbles and falls, but the one that endures through the ages and delivers us into eternity.

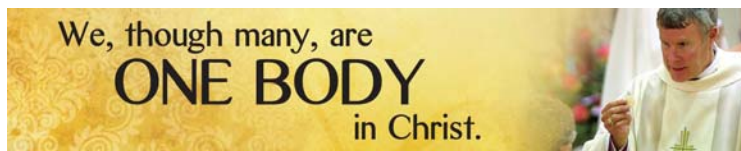

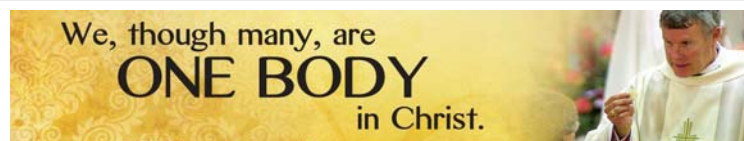
