### FROM THE PASTOR:



**Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Bear Witness is June 21–July 4.** The bishops of the United States are again asking us to celebrate the “Fortnight for Freedom” this year with a focus on the “freedom to bear witness” to the truth of the Gospel. This is first and foremost a spiritual effort, not a political one.

The benefits of religious freedom (namely, recognition of natural rights of conscience practice and of conscience, of the right to live one’s faith in a consistent way in daily life, of the just limits of government



power, of the priority of certain moral realities to civil law, etc.) are for all, and the loss of religious freedom affects all. We therefore engage in this effort in a spirit of prayer, solidarity, and atonement for the sins of our country against human freedom. This event covers the time in our liturgical calendar which celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power.

Throughout these fourteen [14] we are also asked to fast and pray and to encourage all our parishioners to fast and pray, for our country and for the defense of religious freedom during these two weeks.

“Fasting” means any pious act of self-denial, with the intention of joining that to the merits of Christ. It could be, for example, similar to the Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fasting, or it could be abstaining from meat, or from dessert, or the like, on certain days. In terms of prayers, Bishop Nickless particularly recommends the Rosary; and since, in so many of our parishes, there are many who so diligently and devoutly pray the Rosary, they can easily be encouraged to offer at least some of these prayers for this intention.

“Keeping the spirit of the Gospel means that Catholic institutions are to bear witness in love to the full truth about the human person by providing social, charitable, and educational services in a manner that fully reflects the God-given dignity of the human person.” - *Archbishop William E. Lori, Chairman, Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, on the "Freedom to Bear Witness".*

Today is the Thirteenth (13<sup>th</sup>) Sunday in Ordinary Time. Who among us would not welcome a miracle? While we can look back in time and see the miracles of the past, it may not be so easy to see those in our own day. It takes faith to be able to recognize miracles. It requires taking time out of our busy schedules to pray and contemplate God’s actions in our world. There are miracles occurring today, we have only to believe in order to see.

The Liturgy requires many ministers. This week I wish to focus on the ministry of the Altar Server. We are in need of some additional Altar Servers as there are times and some Masses when we are short or missing Altar Servers. If you know of anyone who would make a good Altar Servers [grade 4-adult], please ask them to volunteer using the form inside this bulletin. 22. These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish. To cite one example, **most of the paper we produce is thrown away and not recycled.** It is hard for us to accept that the way natural ecosystems work is exemplary: plants synthesize nutrients which feed herbivores; these in turn become food for carnivores, which produce significant quantities of organic waste which give rise to new generations of plants. But our industrial system, at the end of its cycle of production and consumption, has not developed the capacity to absorb and reuse waste and by-products. We have not yet managed to adopt a circular model of production capable of preserving resources for present and future generations, while limiting as much as possible the use of nonrenewable resources, moderating their consumption, maximizing their efficient use, reusing and recycling them. A serious consideration of this issue would be one way of counteracting the throwaway culture which affects the entire planet, but it must be said that only limited progress has been made in this regard. **YOUCAT QUOTE:** The Youth Catechism, written in language suitable for young people, deals with the entire Catholic faith as it was presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The numbers after each question/answer refer to more extensive and in-depth treatments in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC for short.

**Question #138: How is the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church Structured?**

In the church there are the laity and clerics .as children of god, they are of equal dignity. They have equally important but different tasks. The mission of the laity is to direct the whole world toward the kingdom of God. In addition, there are the ordained ministers (clerics), who have the duties of ecclesiastical governance, teaching, and sanctification. In both states of life, there are Christians who place themselves at God's disposal in a special way through celibacy, poverty, and obedience (for example, consecrated religious). [871-876,934,935]

Every Christian has the duty to bear witness to the Gospel by his own life. But God walks a special path with each person. Some he sends as laymen, so that they might build up the kingdom of God by their family and occupation in the midst of the world. For this purpose, he bestows on them in Baptism and CONFIRMATION all the necessary gifts of the Holy Spirit. Others he entrusts with the pastoral ministry; they are to govern, teach, and sanctify his people. No one can take this duty upon himself; the Lord himself must send him on his way with his divine power through Holy Orders, so that he can act in the place of Christ and administer the SACRAMENTS.

**ORDAINED MINISTRIES IN THE LITURGY:** Bishops and priests are called to act in the Liturgy in the very person of Christ, on behalf of his people, pronouncing the most sacred prayers of our faith, presiding over the celebration of the sacred mysteries, explaining God's Word and feeding God's People on the Body and Blood of Christ. A bishop has the added responsibility of being the chief shepherd, the principal liturgist of his diocese in his role as the successor of the Apostles. By God's grace others are ordained to the ministry of deacon. In the celebration of the Mass deacons proclaim the Gospel, occasionally preach the homily, and assist the bishop and priest in exercising their sacred duties. *Odor-Eaters*

Is it impossible for a couple to become pregnant when using NFP? No. However, neither is it impossible for conception to occur when a couple is using oral or any other form of artificial contraception. 

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) and RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF CHILDREN (RCIC)** is the process by which the Catholic Church prepares and welcomes new members who are over the age of [7] seven and who have either not been baptized or have been baptized in other faith communities and who were baptized in the Catholic Church but not raised Catholic and wish to join the Catholic Church. This process includes learning sessions and prayer with the catechumens (those who have not been baptized) and with the candidates (those who have been baptized).

**From the Code of Canon Law (the law of the Roman Catholic Church) ON THE TEMPORAL GOODS OF THE CHURCH**

can. 1276 §1 It is the responsibility of the ordinary to supervise carefully the administration of all the goods which belong to the public juridic persons subject to him with due regard for legitimate titles attributing even more significant rights to the same ordinary.

§2 Ordinaries are to see to the organization of the entire administration of ecclesiastical goods by issuing special instructions within the limits of universal and particular law with due regard for rights, legitimate customs and circumstances.
