This weekend we welcome to our area the bike riders beginning their first day of RAGBRAI XLIII. May your time in our communities be pleasant, the hills low, the wind be at your back, and the weather agreeable. May you enjoy the ride of your life! Sunday morning please check out the t-shirts and trail mix provided by the St. Michael Guild at the KC Hall and the Belgium Waffle Breakfast provided by the Knights of Columbus and youth of St. Michael at the Kingsley Community Center.

On Tuesday July 14 it was announced that a top executive at Planned Parenthood Dr. Deborah Nucatola, Senior Director of Medical Services for Planned Parenthood Federation of America, was caught on tape. And what is revealed is downright horrific. **Warning: Her words are deeply disturbing.** The new undercover footage shows Dr. Nucatola describing how Planned Parenthood allegedly sells the body parts of aborted children and using partial-birth abortions to supply intact body parts to Pro-life investigators from the Center for Medical Progress who posed as businessmen interested in acquiring fetal body parts. Dr. Nucatola described in detail that abortion procedures are tailored in order to preserve the organs of unborn children:

"I'd say a lot of people want liver. And for that reason, most providers will do this case under ultrasound guidance, so they'll know where they're putting their forceps. The kind of rate-limiting step of the procedure is calvarium. Calvarium—the head—is basically the biggest part."

"We've been very good at getting heart, lung, liver, because we know that, so I'm not gonna crush that part, I'm gonna basically crush below, I'm gonna crush above, and I'm gonna see if I can get it all intact."

There are laws against this as Federal law bans the sale of body parts of aborted babies and makes the sale or purchase a felony punishable by up to 10 years in prison, and a fine of up to \$500,000. But this video shows that the abortion industry is so callous that they don't blink an eye at the trafficking of baby body parts. We need to get to the bottom of this gruesome black market and to let Americans know exactly what is happening in abortion facilities across the country. I urge you to call the Capitol Switchboard at **202-224-3121**, ask to speak to your Representative, and demand that Congress hold an immediate investigation into this barbaric practice. You may also our representatives. Contact information may be found on the parish website.

FROM LAUDATO SI ["Praise be to you, my Lord"], ON CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME, Pope Francis: In 1971, eight years after *Pacem in Terris*, Blessed Pope Paul VI referred to the ecological concern as "a tragic consequence" of unchecked human activity: "Due to an ill-considered exploitation of nature, humanity runs the risk of destroying it and becoming in turn a victim of this degradation". He spoke in similar terms to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations about the potential for an "ecological catastrophe under the effective explosion of industrial civilization", and stressed "the urgent need for a radical change in the conduct of humanity", inasmuch as "the most extraordinary scientific advances, the most amazing technical abilities, the most astonishing economic growth, unless they are accompanied by authentic social and moral progress, will definitely turn against man". YOUCAT QUOTE: The Youth Catechism, written in language suitable for young people, deals with the entire Catholic faith as it was presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The numbers after each question/answer refer to more extensive and in-depth treatments in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC for short.

Question #141: What is the Pope's responsibility? As successor of St. Peter and head of the college of bishops, the POPE is the source and guarantor of the CHURCH'S unity. He has the supreme pastoral authority and the final authority in doctrinal and disciplinary decisions. [880-882, 936-937]

Jesus gave Peter a unique position of preeminence among the apostles. This made him the supreme authority in the early Church. ROME—the local Church that Peter led and the place of his martyrdom—became after his death the internal reference point of the young Church. Every Christian community had to agree with Rome; that was the standard for the true, complete, and unadulterated apostolic faith. To this day every BISHOP of Rome has been, like Peter, the supreme shepherd of the Church, whose real Head is Christ. Only in this capacity is the Pope "Christ's Vicar on earth". As the highest pastoral and doctrinal authority, he watches over the transmission of the true faith. If need be, he must revoke commissions to teach doctrine or relieve ordained ministers of their office in cases of serious failures in matters of faith and morals. Unity in matters of faith and morals, which is guaranteed by the Church's MAGISTERIUM, or teaching authority, with the Pope at the head, is one reason for the remarkable resilience and influence of the Catholic Church.



From the Code of Canon Law (the law of the Roman Catholic Church) ON THE TEMPORAL GOODS OF THE CHURCH

can. 1279 §1 The administration of ecclesiastical goods is the responsibility of the individual who immediately governs the person to whom the goods belong unless particular law, statutes or lawful custom provide otherwise and with due regard for the right of the ordinary to intervene in case of negligence by an administrator.

§2 As regards the administration of the goods of a public juridic person which does not have its own administrators in virtue of law or the charter of the foundation or its own statutes, the ordinary to whom such a person is subject is to appoint suitable persons as administrators for three year terms, and they may be reappointed by the ordinary.
