The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

I think that one of the greatest crisis's of the Catholic Church during the past 30 years, beyond the priest sex abuse scandal, and more far-reaching than the shortage of vocations to the priesthood and religious life – is the crisis we are experiencing in the lack of reverence for the Eucharist. With this weekend's Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*, the Body and Blood of Christ, perhaps we can consider ways to restore proper reverence. Some would argue that the problem is the changes that have taken place since Vatican II. I however, think it has more to do with the kind of society we live in and how it influences us.

Our culture moves rapidly and because of the rapid pace of everything that we are involved in, we have become very impatient. I heard a comedian say that we are so impatient nowadays that they have discovered a new measurement of time. Scientists used to say the smallest fraction of time was the nano-second, but now they have discovered an even smaller fraction of time. It is time between when the stoplight turns green and the guy behind you starts honking his horn! This lack of patience even affects us when we come to Mass.

I would like to point out three areas where we need to combat irreverence manifesting itself as impatience during Mass. First is the very moment of receiving communion. It is the Lord whom we take into our hands or on our tongues. We should show great reverence by bowing and adoring Jesus just prior to receiving him. While in line, don't get frustrated that someone in front of you cannot move quickly. Fold your hands and spend your time in line thinking about the Real Presence. In the Eucharist God humbles himself so much that he takes the appearances of bread to be eaten. Reverence means we recognize the substance beneath the appearance.

A second area we need to develop greater patience - and reverence - is during the Eucharistic Prayer itself. In it Jesus renews his selfless sacrifice for our salvation. It's like being at both the Last Supper as well as at the foot of the cross with Mary, but even more so because Jesus wishes to join each one of us with his saving sacrifice. We hear the Eucharistic prayers said so often that we sort of go into a type of 'auto-pilot' and don't listen to the words any more. Pay attention, and think about how the words apply to you.

Lastly, a third area of greater reverence is the time of meditation after communion. When the hymn ends, we generally have some time of silence while the hosts are placed back in the tabernacle and the priest returns to his chair. During this time we should recognize that our own bodies have become living tabernacles! We are called to intense worship. There is no required posture at that time - some might be more reverent by being seated and closing their eyes. Most people wish to kneel until the priest is seated.

We've all heard the exchange where one person says that they "don't get anything out of Mass" and the other responds "what did you put into it?" Can we all try to put worldly concerns out of our minds and focus on Jesus? I firmly believe that if we patiently focus on the implications of Jesus' Word and Eucharist at every Mass, we will never find ourselves regretting the time we spend reverencing his presence.

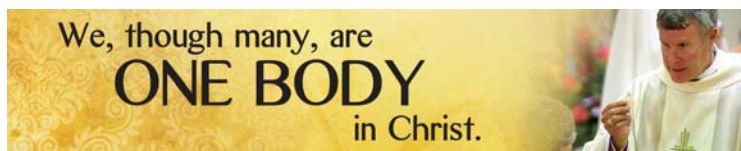

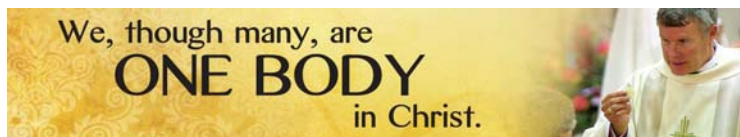
