**4 September 2016**

**Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

At first glance this week's gospel sounds too severe, if not entirely wrong. How could Jesus expect us to hate our parents, wife, children, other family members, all our possessions, and even our own life, in order to follow him?

What Jesus is doing is nudging us towards a glimpse of the fundamental shift in priorities required to "enter through the narrow gate". We all want better lives now and hope to make it into heaven later. What Jesus is suggesting is that we tend to set our goals too low or in erroneous directions, that we underestimate the enormity of change and transformation that is both possible and required of us.

Politicians keep promising that if we elect them they will solve all our problems by changing external structures in our society (healthcare system, minimum wage, tax codes, redefining our rights, etc). And of course, no matter who is elected and what is changed, we experience little or no lasting improvement. That will always be the case because what we need is a change of heart, not a change in lawmakers.

St. Thomas Aquinas was asked by the king of Cyprus to recommend to him the best form of government. Perhaps unsurprisingly given his questioner, Aquinas recommended a benevolent monarchy. But during their discussion, Aquinas argued that even if the government was a dictatorship, there was little to gain by violently overthrowing it, because the dictator most likely would be replaced by another, possibly worse, dictator. Aquinas's point was that changes in our political, economic or social structures will ultimately not lead to improved lives unless our hearts fundamentally change as well.

The people in this week's gospel are not following Jesus for the right reasons. Yes, they were looking for change, but did not understand that following Jesus required a key change in how they related to God and neighbor. They were hungry and wanted to be fed; they were sick and wanted to be well; they were poor and wanted to be rich; and they believed that the Messiah would deliver those things to them. So they followed Jesus enthusiastically, full of hope and anticipating that they were going to receive a vastly improved life.

Instead, Jesus challenged them. Like the tower builder, he asked if they realized the cost of what they were undertaking. Like the king, did they appreciate the enormity of the task? What is evident is that there was an underlying misunderstanding between Jesus and his followers. They were following him because they expected him to change the external conditions of their lives, but they didn't want to change themselves. All they really wanted was to get healthy, wealthy, and to be secure. Are we any different?

They wanted a change in how they experienced their life, but Jesus wanted to give them eternal life. They wanted change, but they wanted it on their terms, for the betterment of their families, and the upgrading of their possessions and security. Are we any different?

Today, Jesus is asking us to think in terms of the "big picture". Asking us to give up the things in our lives that prevent us from becoming the people we were created to be: to let go of whatever distances us or distracts our attention from God - which can even include family. Amen.

**PERSONS WISHING TO JOIN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH**, whether baptized in another faith or unbaptized and over the age of seven [7], should contact the pastor to begin the process known as RCIA at anytime of the year.
