Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

There is a story about a priest who gave a homily on this week's gospel and at the end of Mass, a man commented to him, "Boy, Father, I sure hope they got your point." Do you get the feeling he himself missed the message? And, more importantly, do we? Do we believe church is the place we go to find out how our children, relatives, and neighbors can be better persons?

First the good news: the Pharisee wasn't really a bad guy. He had a lot going for himself. He was honest and did not cheat others. How are we doing in those departments? He fasted two times a week. Do we fast? He gave 10% of his income to God. Surveys show that, in terms of income, we make more but are much less generous than our grandparents. He prayed four times each day. When some of us come to Mass on Sunday, we applaud ourselves. We feel that we've done God a favor. A few even slip out before Mass is ended, and in doing so they give bad example to our young people. Would that we had the courage to imitate the Pharisee in what I call the Big Three: praying, fasting, and good works. Can you imagine what our parish life would be like? Can you imagine what our family lives would be like!

Here's the bad news: the Pharisee was a snob. He was swept off his feet big time by his goodness and importance. His prayer consisted of trumpets to his humble self and his object of worship was himself. He was telling God there were only two perfect people - himself and God. And he was entertaining very serious doubts about God.

The word 'humility' was born from the Latin word 'humus', 'dirt' or 'earth'. Thus humility demands that we stay grounded. But many of us, while admitting that we are not perfect, seriously downplay our own faults and obsess over the faults of others.

I have met few genuinely great people. One was Dave Thomas, the Founder of Wendy's restaurants. He would not speak of himself. He wanted to know of my work. I was very proud to tell him at boring length. When I left him, I regretfully realized I had been the Pharisee of this parable. He had been the protagonist. He said nothing about himself and allowed me to go on and on proudly about myself. In so acting, he taught me much about myself.

"The beginning of wisdom," said Francis of Assisi, "is to know who God is and who you are." This week's parable challenges us to do just that.

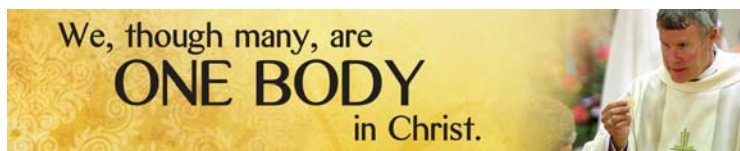

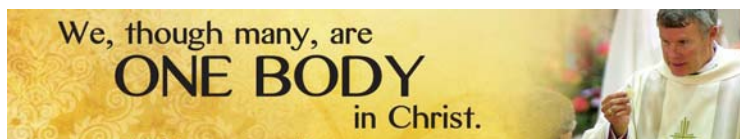
