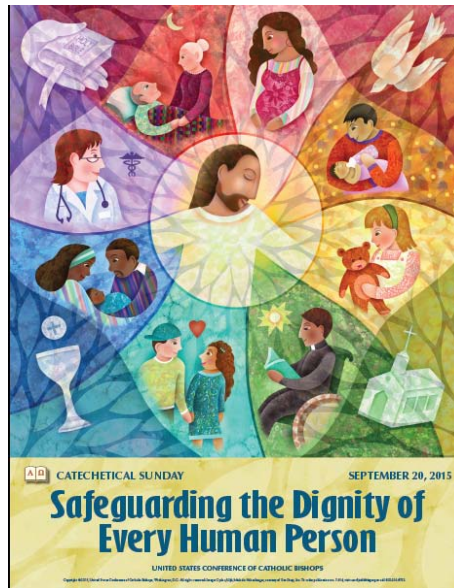


FAITH FORMATION PARENT/FAMILY PRESCHOOL-12th GRADE HANDBOOK 2015-2016

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WELCOME to St. Michael Catholic Parish Faith Formation program! We strive to offer a quality Faith Formation program that provides religious education for your children as well as the opportunity to pray together and form community with the other members of our program. We look forward to meeting you and working together with you to ensure a great experience for your family.

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

MISSION STATEMENT: The mission of St. Michael Parish is to respond to our baptismal call, serve God, congregation and community with our talents and resources. With the leadership of our pastor, our values of prayer, liturgy, stewardship, family, education and evangelization shall be the focus of this parish.

GENERAL INFORMATION

FAITH FORMATION is what we do each Wednesday afternoon/evening with our young parishioners in order to assist the faith formation that parents/families do at home.

This parish activity is about forming our young parishioners into good citizens of God's Kingdom. This involves more than learning facts about our faith, but being able to put our faith into action.

Many people refer to this as "Religious Education" which offers the facts of our faith, while Faith Formation helps us to believe and to act as people of God. Many people refer to this as "CCD" which is actually the abbreviation for CONFRATERNITY OF CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE. This is an office in Rome that reviews and approves texts to be used by parishes and schools, including bibles, The Catechism, and the textbooks we use in our homes and in our Faith Formation programs.

Another term for Faith Formation is "Catechesis" which refers to facilitating the students' faith by Catechists, the faith guides [teachers] who share their faith with our young parishioners on Wednesdays.

FAITH FORMATION is the title that is being used more and more to emphasize what we must do, to be formed in our faith into the image of God.

BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

Faith Formation General Rules

- Everyone is to be treated courteously and with respect. This includes other children, catechists, assistants, volunteers, staff and parents.
- Students will come to class prepared to learn and willing to participate in activities in their class. No student will be allowed to interfere with the learning and participation of other students.
- No loud talking, yelling, or running in the building.
- No gum brought into the building.

- **No caps or hats are to be worn in the building.**
- **NO CELL PHONES allowed in the building.**
- Respect all property and share in the care of your classroom.

Faith Formation General Rules for Students

- Attend Mass as a family each Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation.
- Recognize the importance of Faith Formation at every grade level.
- Give priority to attendance at weekly Faith Formation classes.
- Inform the Director of Faith Formation of any special needs or circumstances that may affect their child in Faith Formation class including health and/or learning issues (i.e. ADD, ADHD, autistic, allergies, reading difficulties, etc.)

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

POLICY ON FAITH FORMATION

- In accord with Diocesan policy promulgated January 2004; all students are required to participate in two years of formal preparation [religious education, faith formation] before the celebration of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- Catechists receive the benefit of free tuition for their children.
- Absences shall be defined as excused or unexcused.
 - Excused absences are for illness, family tragedy, or for participation in an organized event [i.e. a school sports activity during district or state games]. The school office (378-2021) is to be notified by a Parent/Guardian ahead of class session for the absence to be classified as excused.
 - Unexcused absences are for failure to attend a class session, the office is not notified ahead of time, or the absence is for an event not classified as excused.
 - The Director of Faith Formation will make determination of the type of absence, with all final decisions resting with the pastor.
- Students need to demonstrate the ability to understand the materials presented or to pass a basic comprehension test before being promoted to the next grade level.
- Students missing any grade level will be expected to understand the materials presented and to pass a basic comprehension test before being admitted to their current grade level as in public school.

Attendance Policy

It is the policy of St. Michael Parish that Faith Formation students attend all classes to receive the maximum benefit from the program. Excessive absenteeism will result in a conference with the Director of Faith Formation and/or the Pastor.

Attendance

To receive the maximum benefit from the Faith Formation program students are asked to arrive promptly and to attend all Faith Formation classes. If your child will be absent, please call the office at 378-2021 to inform the staff.

Arrival-Dismissal

Students are expected to be in their classroom when the bell rings. Students will be dismissed from their classroom when the bell rings.

Cancellation of Classes

In the event of severe weather, classes may be cancelled. If Woodbury Central or Lawton-Bronson schools are dismissed early due to weather OR have classes cancelled for the day, Immaculate Conception Faith Formation classes will be automatically cancelled as well.

Cancellations will be announced on the parish website, www.westforkcatholiccommunity.org, parish Facebook page, and via e-mail and text notifications for those who have provided to the parish office with contact information and a request for such notification.

Discipline Policy

Discipline is defined as the training that develops self-control, character, and orderly conduct, as well as acceptance of or submission to authority and control. The Faith Formation staff of St. Michael's has the authority and responsibility to set discipline codes and maintain good order in the classrooms and Parish. The children in the Faith Formation program are entitled to learn and develop in a setting which promotes respect for self, others and property. Catechists, parents and students are charged with cooperating to develop mature, healthy and responsible individuals capable of self-control. It is essential that all students give the catechists their full cooperation. Notices of poor behavior may be sent home as needed if discipline problems are considered to be continual or extremely disruptive.

Students creating a disruptive environment may be dismissed from the class temporarily or permanently and the parents contacted so that corrective action may be taken for the good of all persons involved.

Facility Use

Children will not be allowed in any room unsupervised. Children are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful manner. Each class is responsible for restoring the rooms to the proper order.

Picking Up a Child Early

If you pick up your child before Faith Formation classes are over, you must notify the Faith Formation staff before your child may leave.

Visitors

It is our policy not to allow young people who are not registered students to visit. Parents are invited to visit at any time.

Parental Involvement

The Parish recognizes the supreme responsibility of parents as the first and foremost teachers of their children in the matters of faith. Your example, prayer life and participation in the weekly Sunday liturgy and other sacraments speak volumes to your children. There are many ways to be formally involved in the Faith Formation program. Parents are needed as catechists, assistants, etc. Please contact the office if you are interested.

As a parent, you are welcome to visit your child's classroom at any time. Please check in with the office. Also, please help your children learn their prayers and review any papers or materials they may bring home.

Grievance Procedure Guidelines

It shall be the policy of St. Michael Faith Formation that as a Catholic faith community, open communication between parents, students, teachers, staff and administrators is encouraged in all programs. It is the intent of the St. Michael Parish Faith Formation Program that all such interaction shall be conducted in a respectful Christian manner, as we believe Christ has taught us “with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace.” In all such interactions, all parties involved shall strive to “be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven (us) in Christ.” We believe that in following Christ’s example, we can create an environment in all our education programs that allows our children the best opportunity to grow and achieve academic, spiritual and social success.

Grievance Procedure for Parents

It shall be the policy of St. Michael Faith Formation that if an occasion arises that a parent feels a problem has occurred at Faith Formation, the parent will use the following procedure:

1. Contact the Catechist to discuss the problem.
2. Catechist will contact the Director of Faith Formation.
3. The parent may be asked to attend a meeting with the catechist, Director of Faith Formation and/or pastor to reach a solution.
4. The Pastor makes the final decision.

Volunteer Screening

All volunteers who have contact with children must complete a screening form annually. This screening is for the safety and well being of our children and the protection of the parish and volunteer. Our Volunteers also take part in Virtus Sessions to protect your child and themselves.

Blood-Borne Pathogens

Blood and other bodily fluids will be considered infectious. Reasonable precautions (rubber gloves, disinfecting with bleach) will be used.

Accidents and Illness

If your child becomes ill or has an accident during Faith Formation classes, the parent or guardian or emergency reference will be notified. An accident report will be filed and basic first aid applied.

Health Information

Please inform the office regarding any health concerns (allergies, special diet needs, learning disabilities, chronic health issues, etc.) that may affect your child during Faith Formation classes. This information will be shared with your child’s catechist.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMS

The Parish recognizes parents as the primary educators of their children as they are the first teachers in their children’s lives. According to the United States bishops, parents have the “right and duty” to be intimately involved in the sacramental preparation of their children. This obligation springs from the commitment made by the parents at the child’s baptism to form them in the Catholic faith.

Preparation for the sacraments of **Reconciliation** and **Eucharist** is offered during the second grade year.

Confirmation preparation is offered every two [2] years. All parents of children preparing to celebrate sacraments are expected to participate in all parent meetings, family experiences, and the celebration of the Sacrament. On 1 May 2013 a request was made for the age to be lowered to 9-10th grade. This was approved at the 18 June 2013 meeting of the Parish Council. This year, students ready for Confirmation in the 9-10th grades will be prepared for Confirmation to be celebrated on Sunday 17 April 2016, 10:30 a.m. at St. Michael Church in Kingsley.

Enrollment for Special Circumstances

It is the policy of St. Michael Parish that there be an evaluation of any students entering grades two through eight who were not associated with a Faith Formation program or Catholic school in prior years. The pastor will be contacted for more information.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC)

Children who are age seven [7] or above and have not yet celebrated the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist are to participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC). Separate preparation classes will be held during the year so they may celebrate these sacraments when they are ready. Please contact the Pastor or Director of Faith Formation for more information.

Communal Reconciliation

Students will have the opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation at two communal services during the year. These celebrations will occur during class time. Parents are asked to help prepare the children for Reconciliation by reviewing the Act of Contrition found later in this handbook.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR 2015-2016

The Faith Formation program meets on Wednesday for grades preschool-12. Sessions are held on Wednesdays from 4:00–5:00 P.M. for grades preschool-4 and 7:00–8:00 P.M. for grades 5-12. The program begins the first Wednesday in September and ends the last Wednesday in April.

If you are registering a child in second grade and above who has not had any previous Faith Formation or Catholic School, you will need to schedule an appointment with the pastor to discuss your situation.

In addition to Sunday, the days to be observed as holy days of obligation in the Latin Rite dioceses of the United States of America, in conformity with canon 1246, are as follows:

August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary;*
November 1, the solemnity of All Saints;*
December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception;
December 25, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

*Whenever January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is cancelled.
